



DIRECTIONS FROM NASHVILLE

(allow 1 hour from Nashville)

1. **I-65 South** (towards Huntsville/Birmingham) • **55 mi**
2. Take **exit 27** for **Tennessee 129** toward Lynnville/Cornersville • **0.2 mi**
3. Turn right onto **TN-129**. Roll down the windows, enjoy the scenery, and smell the country air • **7.3 mi**
4. Arrive in **Lynnville**: You will go over train tracks at the little town of Lynnville.
 - If you aren't on a tight schedule, check out Colonel Littleton, specializing in fine leather goods - headquartered in Lynnville, Tennessee. If he's in and not busy, you might get to see one of his many treasured "company cars" that are as old as the farm. Have a made to order burger, fries, and a shake at Soda Pop Junction and check out the train car of Milky Way Farm at the Lynnville Train Museum with photos of the farm in its glory days).
5. **Continue on 129** (or if you stopped and played in Lynnville, turn right to be on 129) • **1.6 mi**
6. Turn **left onto US-31 S/TN-7 S/Columbia Hwy** • **4.2 mi**
 - Travel over a couple hills. After 3 miles or so, Richland School will be on the left. If you have time, pick up a Sundrop at Richland Market- a favorite Giles County beverage
 - Soon after Richland School, the farm will begin on the right side of the road. Notice the curved stone barn on the hill. Frank Mars liked to build his barns with the curves of the landscape. The stone was from Milky Way Farm's quarry.
7. Turn **right onto Milky Way Road**.
 - The main entrance to the farm has stone columns and an iron arch connecting the columns just past the race track. Travel on the road along the white fencing. Richland Creek will be on your left and the historic Racehorse Barn foundation on your right. Continue on Milky Way Rd until you reach a circle in the road. Go ½ way around so that you are still continuing straight.
 - The first gravel drive on the right will take you to the historic Milky Way Farm manor house at the top of the hill. From here you can get to just about anywhere on the farm!
